


3. Polish Government Scholarship Program for Young Researchers

Program is open for candidates not older than 35 years old.




Scholarship offer

Scholarships offered within the programme include 9 month internship conducted at public universities.

The scholarship that covers the costs of accommodation and living amounts to PLN $_{\mbox{\scriptsize 1350}}$ per month.

About the programme

The Stefan Banach Scholarship Programme was launched in 2013 as a common initiative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Poland.

Stefan Banach – the patron of the programme was an outstanding Polish mathematician, co-founder of the Lwow School of Mathematics and functional analysis (branch of mathematics) – a colorful and intriguing personality whose contribution to the world science is indisputable.

The aim of the programme is to support the social and economic growth of the Eastern Partnership countires by increasing the level of education and professional skills of the citizens of those countries.

Participation in the programme is a great opportunity to become familiar with the Polish culture and language. It also gives a possibility to mix and mingle with Polish students and academics.



Scholarship offer

Scholarships offered within the programme support fee-free 2nd (Master) and 3rd (PhD) degree studies at public universities.

The amount of the scholarship that covers the costs of accommodation and living, amounts to PLN 1350 per month.


The scholarship offer is addressed to the citizens of the Eastern Partnership countries: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Republic of Moldova and Ukraine.

Scholarship grantees may benefit from The Erasmus Programme and study one semester abroad at a chosen university. $\dot{}$

Beginning from the academic year 2015/16 scholarship offer has been extended for the 3rd degree that enables students to develop their interests during doctoral studies.

About the programme

The Ignacy Łukasiewicz Scholarship Programme was launched in 2015 as a common initiative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Poland.

The new programme is an extension of the previous scholarship offered in the fields of technical science (implemented since the academic year 2013/14), which was addressed to the citizens of developing countries – candidates for PhD studies.

Ignacy Łukasiewicz – the patron of the programme was a prominent Polish scientist, pharmacist, oil industry pioneer and the inventor of the kerosene lamp.

The aim of the programme is to support the social and economic growth of developing countries by increasing the level of education and professional skills of their citiznes.

Participating in The Ignacy Łukasiewicz Programme is a good path for those who would like to improve their intercultural competences. Not only does it give a possibility to become familiar with the Polish culture, but also is a great opportunity to join the multicultural network.



Scholarship offer

Scholarships offered within the programme support fee-free 2nd (Master) and 3rd (PhD) degree studies at public universities.

The amount of the scholarship, which covers the costs of accommodation and living, amounts to PLN 1350 per month.

The programme is primarily aimed at the citizens of: Angola, Colombia, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Kenya, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, Myanmar, Nigeria, Senegal, South Africa, Tanzania, Vietnam and Palestine.

The Ignacy Łukasiewicz Scholarship Programme consists of two types of schoarships:

- Master studies (preceded by one-year Polish language preparatory course) in science, natural sciences, technical science, agricultural, forestry and veterinary sciences (45 scholarships per year);
- PhD studies in the fields: mathematics, physics, chemistry, biology, Earth science, technical sciences, agricultural, forestry and veterinary sciences (15 scholarships per year).
